Barbers cut, trim, shampoo, and style hair. They also may fit hairpieces, perform facials, and offer facial shaving.

You'll even learn chemical hair services such as coloring, bleaching, and highlighting hair. Common tools include combs, scissors, straight razors, and clippers.

Program Objective

Students in the Barbering program will gain the knowledge necessary to be successful in the barbering industry.

The program consists of comprehensive instruction in the practice of barbering including hair and scalp treatments, facials and massage, shaving and facial hair design, haircutting and styling techniques and hair replacement. Business skills and general sciences will also be covered.

Training will include classroom theory and hands-on learning working on models and guests in the student clinic. In addition to a strong foundation of safety, appropriate work habits, and business skills, graduates are prepared to take the State Board Examination, and upon passing, begin working in entry-level careers as a licensed barber, in a salon, spa, or barbershop.
